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### **FOREWORD**



The year 2024 was a landma<mark>rk for the National Anti-</mark> Doping Center of Ukraine, marked by significant achievements, new challeng<mark>es, and substantial</mark> changes that reinforced our position within the global anti-doping community.

One of the key accomplishments was the development and approval of the NADC Development Strategy through 2028, which outlines the priorities for the coming years: enhancing the testing system, expanding educational programs, strengthening international cooperation. and advancing digitalization.

A notable milestone was the implementation of the program for the Paris Olympic Games. The extensive educational cycle carried out within the framework of this program helped participants prepare both physically and morally, adhering to the principles of fairness and ethics in sports.

We take pride in signing 14 cooperation agreements with national sports federations, enabling the more effective implementation of anti-doping standards at all levels.

The introduction of the position of Ombudsman for Clean Sport and the launch of the "Clean Sport Ambassadors" project have strengthened dialogue with the sports community and contributed to the promotion of fair play principles.



Three NADC employees successfully completed training at the International Testing Agency (ITA) and obtained International Clean Sport Educator certificates, opening up new opportunities for developing modern educational programs.

Additionally, we certified our management system and obtained the DSTU ISO 9001:2015 certificate, confirming highquality management standards and our readiness to effectively address tasks of any complexity.



# ENGAGEMENT WITH STAKEHOLDERS

#### **COOPERATION AGREEMENTS WITH SPORTS FEDERATIONS AND ASSOCIATIONS**

These agreements provide for comprehensive cooperation to systematically conduct activities aimed at the prevention and prohibition of doping use and distribution among athletes, as well as to implement educational programs informing about the dangers of doping. This promotes a systematic approach to combating doping in sport and the active involvement of sports organizations in fostering a culture of clean sport.

#### PARTNERSHIPS WITH SPORTS INFRASTRUCTURE ORGANIZATIONS



As part of these agreements, information is disseminated about the negative consequences of doping use among athletes and support personnel, including coaches and doctors. Educational activities, seminars, and training sessions are conducted to promote a responsible attitude toward health and fair sporting practices.

#### MEMORANDUM WITH THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION AND SCIENCE OF UKRAINE

The memorandum was signed with the aim of developing cooperation in educational, scientific, and innovative activities. It provides for the preparation and implementation of anti-doping education programs, promoting a healthy lifestyle among youth, and fostering legal awareness regarding the prohibition of doping in sport. As part of this memorandum, educational-scientific, scientific-methodological, and legal awareness-raising activities.

# MEMORANDUM OF COOPERATION BETWEEN THE NADC AND THE NATIONAL ACADEMY OF INTERNAL AFFAIRS

The memorandum outlines a wide range of initiatives and activities aimed at enhancing the effectiveness of anti-doping policy and educational efforts, fostering practical collaboration, and providing advisory support in investigations of anti-doping rule violations.



### INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

#### **WADA SYMPOSIUM**

In 2024, NADC leadership participated in the annual symposium of the World Anti-Doping Agency, where key trends and challenges in the fight against doping were discussed. The participation contributed to strengthening partnerships and implementing best practices at the national level. As part of the symposium, an agreement on cooperation was signed with the National Anti-Doping Center of the Republic of Moldova, opening new opportunities for joint initiatives and experience exchange.

#### **ANTI-DOPING SUMMIT**

The Director of the NADC participated in the second Anti-Doping Summit of Central and Eastern European countries, where regional strategies for combating doping were discussed. Participation in the summit contributed to expanding cooperation with countries in the region and coordinating joint efforts to enhance the effectiveness of anti-doping programs.

#### **CAHAMA**

From September 3-5, the Director of the NADC participated in the 64th meeting of the Ad hoc European Committee for the Word Anti-Doping Agency (CAHAMA) and the 59th meeting of the Monitoring Group of the Anti-Doping Convention (T-DO) in Strasbourg, France. Work was carried out to support Ukraine's candidate for the WADA Executive Committee from Europe. Following the vote, CAHAMA supported the candidacy of the head of the Ministry of Youth and Sports, M. Bidny, and recommended approval during the relevant meeting of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe.

#### UNESCO

The National Anti-Doping Center (NADC) participated in virtual information sessions held on December 13, 16, and 17, 2024, at the invitation of the Secretariat of the International Convention Against Doping in Sport. The events focused on the presentation of the enhanced Anti-Doping Logic (ADLogic) system, which will become a key tool for monitoring the implementation of the Convention and preparing national reports for the years 2024–2025.



### INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

#### NADC AND LITHUANIAN NADO WORKSHOP ON THERAPEUTIC USE

As part of the training and informational event, key aspects of working with TUEs (Therapeutic Use Exemptions) were discussed, including:
The policy for submitting TUE requests for athletes of different levels:

The specifics of storing and exchanging documents containing health-related information;

Specific requirements for medical documentation submitted with the requests.

### NADC AND POLADA WORKSHOP ON RESULTS MANAGEMENT

During the training and informational event, discussions were held on cases related to athletes' biological passports and the identified instances of prohibited substance use, practices for concluding substantial assistance agreements, and methods of protecting confidential information.

# TRAINING ON ORGANIZING EDUCATIONAL AND INFORMATIONAL EVENTS IN COOPERATION WITH SLOADO


The training program covered key topics such as: training anti-doping education instructors, integrating educational activities into the operations of national federations, and international experience in organizing educational campaigns. During the training, key principles of anti-doping education for athletes and all stakeholders involved in sport were discussed.

#### PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT WITH THE ANTI-DOPING CENTER OF THE REPUBLIC OF MOLDOVA

In 2024, a cooperation agreement was signed with the National Anti-Doping Center of the Republic of Moldova, opening new opportunities for joint initiatives and the exchange of experience.

## PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT WITH THE POLISH ANTI-DOPING AGENCY

In 2024, a cooperation agreement was signed between the NADC and the Polish Anti-Doping Agency (POLADA). The agreement provides for joint efforts to improve testing methodologies, exchange information, and enhance the professional qualifications of specialists from both sides.
